

Getting online materials

- **Google Scholar:** <http://scholar.google.com> ⇒ (click on the Yale Fulltext link next to the search results)
 - Or: Yale Library ⇒ Orbis Title search ⇒ Location: Yale Internet Resource (*journal title, not article title*)
- **Author's website:** search Google for their name or their department's staff/publications
- **Dissertations and theses:** Yale Library ⇒ Find database ⇒ Dissertations and theses
 - If not found, search for books or articles by author (PDF often withdrawn if published as book)
- **If you live off-campus,** you can still get Yale FullText and databases: Yale library ⇒ Off-Campus Access

Getting printed materials

- **Staff search:** All Yale items can be delivered to the SML counter for pickup (*takes about 1 working day*)
 - Yale Library ⇒ Orbis search ⇒ (click desired item) ⇒ Place Requests ⇒ Request staff search ...
- If Yale's copies are all checked out, use **Borrow Direct** to get books from other Ivies sent to Bass:
 - Yale Library ⇒ Borrow Direct (*takes about 3 days, very reliable*)
- If that fails, **recall** the item (*the current user gets 10 days to return it*):
 - Yale Library ⇒ Orbis search ⇒ (click desired item) ⇒ Place Requests ⇒ Recall items checked out
- Some **library locations** you may need to know about:
 - SML usually closes at 4.45pm on Friday and Saturday.
 - ♦ Navigational guides to the stacks (main shelving area) are posted at the elevators inside the stacks.
 - ♦ If you don't want to navigate the stacks, you can request a **staff search** (see above).
 - ♦ A call number isn't enough to locate a physical item in the Yale library. Get the **classification system** (LC or YC: if not stated then LC) and **size** (regular, +/-oversize, folio: if not stated then regular).
 - LSF is an off-campus shelving facility. To get LSF items you have to request a **staff search** (see above).
 - **Periodical Room** (current issues of journals): 1st floor of SML, on the right of the main entrance.
 - **Linonia and Brothers Room** (leisure reading): 1st floor of SML, on the left of the main entrance.
 - **Starr Main Reference Room:** 1st floor of SML, on the left of the counter/altar.
 - **Linguistics Seminar** is not in HGS, despite what Orbis may say. It's Room 201, 370 Temple St.

Miscellaneous points

- **Web of Science** database helps with locating more recent work (see who cited Johansson's references)
 - Yale Library ⇒ Find Database ⇒ Web of Science
- **Librarians** can help you with research strategies and general library usage.
 - **Our subject librarian** for Linguistics, Lidia Uziel, is *very* helpful. Given our subject matter, I imagine you're also entitled to ask the Biology, Psychology or Anthropology librarians.
 - ♦ Yale Library ⇒ Workshops & Research Education ⇒ Library Subject Specialists
 - **Freshmen and sophomores** should find out who their personal librarian is:
 - ♦ Yale Library ⇒ Workshops & Research Education ⇒ Personal Librarian Program
- **Relevance-ranked search results:** Yale Library ⇒ Orbis Library Catalog ⇒ Search in: Ranked keyword.
- **Journals from the last 10 years** cannot be taken out of the library. See free 'photocopying' below.
- **Free 'photocopying':** You can scan into PDF files at the SML information desk or the Bass photocopying machine cluster (the newest machine: swipe your YaleID, then input your email address).
